Financial Support for Families

Creekside K-9 College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) Eligible families can apply for the Camps, Sports & Excursion fund (CSEF). These funds are paid to the school for use, towards excursions, incursions and camps. To be eligible, a parent or legal guardian must be the holder of a current Healthcare card or Pension card. In order to receive the payment, a CSEF application form (available at the office) must be completed and submitted before the end of Term 2, 2024.
- The college will also consider any requests for financial assistance from families. All requests need to put in writing and emailed to <u>Creekside.K9@education.vic.gov.au</u>. Assistance may be requested for uniform, stationery, camps or school excursions.

Payment Methods

- 2. **Compass** you can pay via the Compass portal. You should have a unique user id and password. If you require these details, please contact the office.
- 3. In person at the Administration Office by cash, credit card or EFTPOS

FREE INSTRUCTION

FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES
