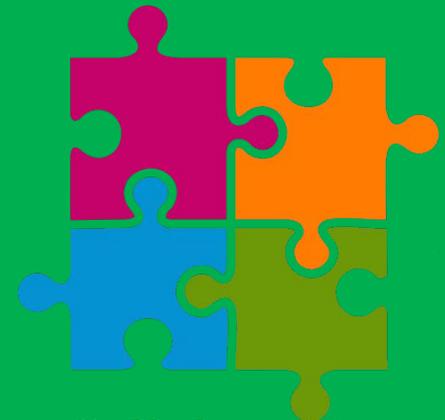

# WHY DO WE NEED LAPTOPS?

As we have worked out, technology is here to stay and becoming an increasing part of education.

Whilst we still complete the bulk of our work in workbooks, laptops often enhance research, presentation and communication.





# SCHOOL ICT SUPPORT

Once a device is purchased, students will be connected to the school network and provided with additional security features.

School ICT support works with students when issues arise, but there are limits to this.

For example, if hardware is broken by accident, families will have to organise a fix.





# MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Students will need a laptop that meets the minimum requirements set out on the College Website.

Tablets such as Ipads are not accepted.

A student/parent agreement will need to be signed in order for students to be logged onto the network.

## **Student Bring Your Own Device Policy (BYOD)**

The increasing availability of personal mobile devices has accelerated the necessity for schools to become more flexible in terms of the devices available to students. Schools are in a unique position to harness students' connection to their own personal mobile devices for the purpose of developing 21st century learning skills and for fostering digital literacy, fluency and citizenship in a safe environment. To this end the College infrastructure will support a BYOD program.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) is the practice of allowing employees, students or members of an organisation (such as a school) to bring and use their own computing devices for work purposes. This is instead of the organisation providing selected devices or requiring members to purchase a specific device.

### **Acceptable Use**

All students and staff have access to the Creekside K-9 College wireless network, including the access to the Internet for teaching and learning. Access to the Creekside K-9 College IT system is a privilege, not a right.

The Acceptable Use Policy is available on the College website and in student diaries. Please read, sign and return the policy to allow the device to be connected to the school network.

### **Objectives:**

- To facilitate and promote the bringing of a computing device to school by all students in Year 7 in 2017, and new students starting in 2017 (Yrs 7-9) for educative use
- To ensure equity in the BYOD program and its implementation
- To ensure all students have access to appropriate technological resources in their classes.
